	Tabled:
( )	a. I am a resident of Stradbroke and am also one of several horse owners in the area. I
	would like to make a request to the council that some horse traffic warnings signs are
	placed around the parish. I live and keep my horses in Barley Green and within this small
	area there are several people who keep and ride horses. Due to a complete lack of
	bridleways or any other available public off road places to ride we are all forced to use
	the roads. Currently there is a complete lack of signage to indicate this in this area.
	Despite having horses which are extremely good in heavy traffic including tractors
	trailers and lorries, both riders and horses wearing high Viz, all too often motorist are
	shocked to come across horses. Too many times dangerous incidents have occurred and
	it saddens me that quite often motorists have become abusive, yelling that we had no
	right to be on the roads, swearing and only last week a tractor driver stuck his middle
	finger up at my 15 yr old daughter as she had given a hand signal asking him to slow
	down as he was towing a large noisy trailer. At least with warning signs drivers will
	hopefully not be surprised to come across horses and riders on the roads. As mentioned
	in the parish magazine there is a need for a speed and lorry watch in the village but the
	dangerous driving is throughout the whole parish and not just the village centre. Living
	on the outskirts I often feel that we are overlooked.
